Day 1: Welcome to Armenia



Arrive in Yerevan, Armenia's warm and lively capital. Upon landing, you'll be met and transferred comfortably to your hotel.

Take the rest of the day to relax or enjoy your first walk through the city—perhaps a café terrace, a sunset view, or your first taste of Armenian cuisine.

Day 2: Monasteries, Wine & Waterfalls



Begin your journey south toward Khor Virap Monastery, one of Armenia's most iconic landmarks, offering breathtaking views of Mount Ararat—a moment every traveler remembers.

Continue to the Areni-1 Cave, home to the world's oldest known winery. Enjoy a tasting of local wines and a traditional lunch, surrounded by history that dates back over 6,000 years.

In the afternoon, unwind at the Shaki Waterfall, where cascading waters and fresh mountain air provide a refreshing close to the day.

Overnight in the charming town of Goris.

Day 3: Tatev, Khndzoresk & the Wild South



Tatev Monastery

Tatev Monastery is a medieval masterpiece perched on the edge of a canyon.

Accessible by the world's longest cable car, it offers spectacular views of the Syunik mountains and a deep dive into Armenia's spiritual history.



Khndzoresk

Khndzoresk is an ancient troglodyte village clinging to the cliffs, famous for its suspension bridge and caves carved into the rock. A unique place where nature and history meet.



Khot Village

Set off on an adventure in a 4x4 from Goris to the village of Tegah, perched on the edge of a deep canyon. Discover ancient caves carved into the rock, wild landscapes, and spectacular views of the Syunik mountains.

An off-the-beaten-path immersion, between raw nature and forgotten history.



Goris

Nestled in the heart of the Syunik mountains, Goris is a charming town surrounded by spectacular rock formations and ancient caves.

Known for its stone architecture and peaceful atmosphere, it is the ideal starting point for exploring Armenia's wild southern region.

Soar above a dramatic canyon on the Tatev cable car, the longest in the world, before exploring the magnificent Tatev Monastery, a jewel of medieval Armenian architecture perched on the edge of the cliffs.

Later, step into another world at Khndzoresk, an ancient cave village connected by a swinging suspension bridge—where history, adventure, and nature collide.

Day 4: Selim Pass, Farm Life & Lake Sevan



The day commences with a drive across the Selim Pass, offering remarkable alpine scenery. Upon arrival, you will visit the historic Selim Caravanserai, an important monument of Silk Road heritage.

Following this, you will be welcomed at the Mikayelyan family farm, where you will receive a guided tour of the facilities. A tasting of the farm's esteemed cheeses, accompanied by honey and seasonal fruit, will be provided, followed by lunch on the premises.



In the afternoon, you will enjoy a cruise on Lake Sevan, allowing time to appreciate the tranquillity of the lake and the surrounding mountain landscape. The programme continues with a visit to Sevanavank Monastery, perched on a peninsula and offering expansive panoramic views.

At the conclusion of the day, you will be transferred to Dilijan, where you will spend the night.

Day 5: Dilijan National Park



A day devoted to nature in the Dilijan National Park.

Begin with a circular hike to Haghartsin Monastery, followed by a walk to a hidden waterfall nestled within the forest.



Haghartsin Monastery

Circular hike through the forest to this stunning monastery, then onward to a hidden waterfall.



Gochavank Monastery

Visit this historic monastery, then enjoy a scenic walk to tranquil Lake Gosh.



Yenokavan

Evening transfer to this serene mountain village for an overnight stay.

Day 6: Yenokavan — Forest Adventures



Located in the heart of the Tavush forests, Yenokavan is a true paradise for nature and horse lovers.



Horseback Riding

Ride along scenic forest trails surrounded by pure mountain air.



Zipline

Experience one of the country's longest ziplines through the canopy.



River Hike

Hike to the river and reconnect with nature in total tranquility.



Day 7: Haghpat, Sanahin & Dsegh



Nature and Heritage

Hike from Haghpat to Sanahin, passing between two monasteries listed as UNESCO World Heritage sites.

Continue to Dsegh, the birthplace of the poet Hovhannes Toumanian.

Enjoy a peaceful hike to Lake Bardzrakash, surrounded by tranquil nature, followed by a short walk to Lake Tsover.

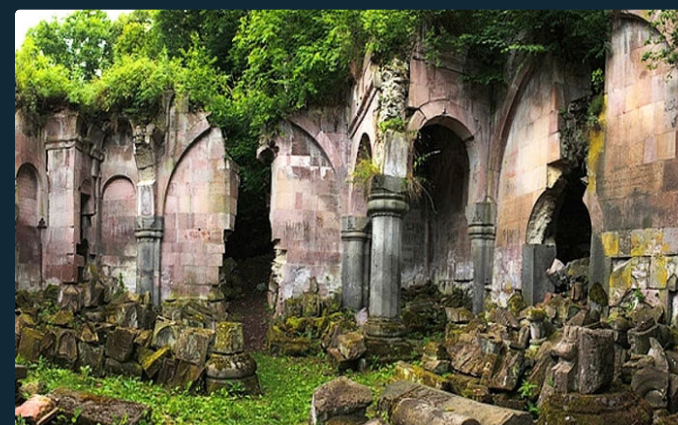
Overnight stay in Dsegh.

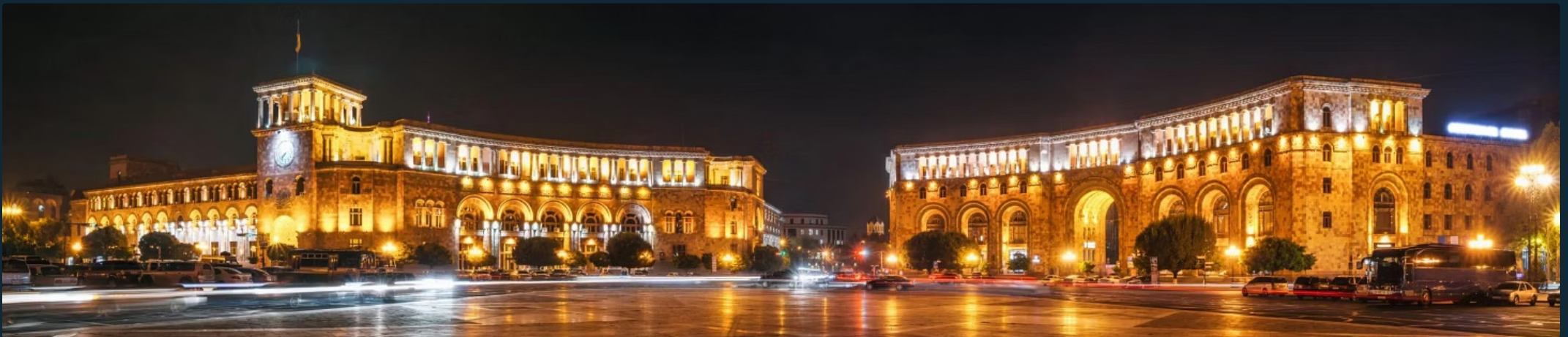

Return to Yerevan for the evening and overnight stay.

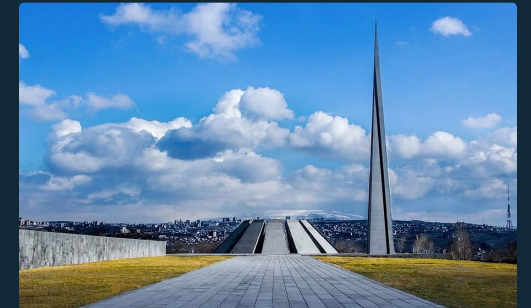
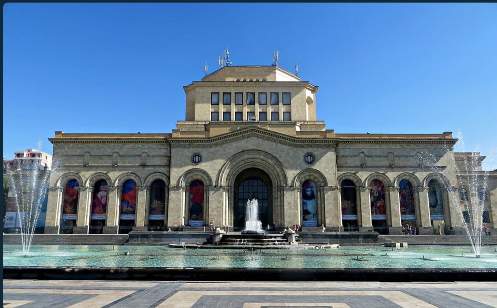


Day 9: Yerevan — A Warm & Vibrant Capital
